There was a plan to hold 3 camps but because of funding and personnel shortages, we only managed one in April and another in October. These camps were judged to be very successful by the students and teachers and the idea, moving forward, is to implement more of them around the country, starting probably in 2020. Plans are underway to apply for funding to not only run the Camps but to also employ staff to run them both in the Waikato and in the Far North.

We produced and posted out a booklet of student writing which is sent to all coaches and students and acts as a great motivator. Another is being putting together at the moment and will be posted out in March 2019.

Jo spent hours and days travelling around the country conducting trainings, all of which were greeted enthusiastically! A very successful hub has been started in Kerikeri, and is now working well.

Kristi Cabot, our Student Coach coordinator lives in Wanaka and she was able to join us for the camp in April and again for a week in November when we had the conference planned. Kristi bought her husband and 2 small children with her and it was great to be able to spend some time with her and the family.

Also contributing to Camp funding was the Valder Ohinemuri Trust, which was very generous.
